Fishing Derby Rules

There are two fishing derbies.

The Regular Annual Fishing Derby determines the largest bass, catfish, crappie, and bluegill caught during the year from Club lakes by BWC members and their family members.

The Youth Fishing Derby is open to BWC family members whose age is 15 years old or less. Fish caught in the Youth Derby are eligible to compete in both the Youth Derby and Regular Annual Derby if they are larger than the current entry on the blackboard.

Both derbies start on November 1 and end on October 31. The Regular Annual Derby is open to all Club members, their children and persons in their immediate household, including males 17 years old and younger.

For entry in the Regular Derby: Measure your fish to the nearest 1/16" and put your name, date, fish length, and lake name on the blackboard if it is larger than the fish listed there. If it is the same length as the listed fish, the first fish prevails. There are no ties.

For entry in the Youth Derby: Measure your fish to the nearest 1/16" and put your name, date, fish length, and lake name on the Youth Derby board if it is larger than the fish listed there. Ties are allowed in the Youth Derby. If it is the same length as the listed fish you should add your name, date and fish length under the current leader.

Carry a measuring device with you and return all bass to the lake very quickly.

Trophies will be awarded for winners in the youth derby at the Ricatra dinner and gift certificates will be awarded to winners in the regular derby.
